Dear Councilmember Zine:

On July 12, 2011, the Winnetka Neighborhood Council (WNC) approved (10-0 with 1 abstention – resolution WNC-2011-071211-04) to support the Village at Westfield Topanga project.

While this project is located in the Canoga Park and Woodland Hills NC boundaries it will have a direct impact on our neighborhood council. The Board understands that these types of developments span the boundaries of NCs in terms of economy, traffic and overall impact.

The WNC carefully considered this project. We recognize that the addition of more shopping outlets and stores will lead to an increase in traffic and congestion on our streets. However, we feel that Westfield and the City will take the necessary steps to mitigate the impact as much as possible. We encourage the City to include as many left hand turn lanes, and traffic mitigation techniques as it can not only in the immediate vicinity of the project but throughout the feeder streets to the location.

It is clear that we our City needs to develop as many economic opportunities as we can to provide new job opportunities to replace those lost as businesses close and manufacturing leaves our community. In addition, the Board understands that the increased economic opportunity will lead to an increased tax base – a resource our cash strapped City is in desperate need of.


